This area will provide additional space for our Reception children and will greatly enhance the EYFS outside provision. Mrs Malir and Mrs Williamson have both been working tirelessly visiting other schools to see how other schools have developed their outdoor areas and they have also been working on ordering new resources for the area. The large area surrounding the canopy was originally going to be grassed but I am looking into other alternatives so this area could then be used by children all year round.

I was appointed Foundation Governor in February 2016.

Before taking early retirement in 2014, I taught music for nearly 30 years in a large 11-18 Comprehensive school in South Yorkshire where I was also an Assistant Head Teacher responsible for Inclusion and Safeguarding. In 1995 I founded the Penistone Schools' Area Choir to represent Barnsley at an International Choral Festival in Germany. PSAC became known as one of the best children's choirs in South Yorkshire, touring both in this country and in Europe. I was also Assistant Organist and Master of the Choristers at Bradford Cathedral for 20 years and had the privilege of playing for many radio and television broadcasts, including the live broadcast of the Royal Maundy in 1997.

I have been the Director of Music at St Oswald's in Guiseley since 2004 and moved to Guiseley in 2015 to follow a freelance career playing, accompanying and teaching organ, piano, singing and theory of music.

In my free time I enjoy fishing, playing golf, walking and going to the gym.

I consider it an honour to be a Governor at Hawksworth and I look forward to getting involved in the life of the school community.
