What has your child been doing this week?

Class 1

We have enjoyed lots of Christmas themed activities this week. We have been making salt dough tree decorations, had a Christmas shop where we had to use 1p and 2p coins to buy things. We have our very own 'Christmas card factory' which we have all been VERY busy in; cutting, stamping, gluing, threading, writing, tracing, delivering and posting cards! We have written some brilliant letters to Santa asking for lots of lovely gifts and not forgetting all the festive songs we have been learning.

Class 2

We have been learning about nouns in Literacy this week. We had to label nouns in the classroom including proper nouns like our names. Mr Norris walked in just as everyone had post it notes stuck to their foreheads! It was very funny. In Maths, Year 2s have been learning how to add and subtract using partitioning and drawing out methods. Year 1s have been re-capping number bonds to 10 and adding and subtracting 3 numbers. Class 3

This week class 3 have been looking at subtraction in Maths, with focus on whether we could use written or mental methods of calculation. In Literacy we are looking at Neil Armstrong's personal qualities as we select appropriate applicants for a top secret space mission to Mars! We have produced a fact file detailing all different kinds of rocks in Science and in Grammar we even used commas to save people's lives!

Class 4

In Literacy, Class 4 have been finishing their non – chronological reports about migrating animals. We have been working on 3D shapes in Maths, describing them using mathematical vocabulary and also making nets. The children have also completed their end of terms Maths, Reading and Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar teats.
