This week Year 1 enjoyed a walk to the Odda woods and exploring nature with Mrs Malir and Miss Ainsworth. (Rec are going to go next week). We have enjoyed lots of outdoor learning and we sat in the sun and had story time with Rupert. We have been exploring our new topic 'Seaside' and have started looking at our new book *Grandad's Island* for our Literacy work. In maths we have been doing time, analogue and digital. Class 2 have settled back into routines quickly this week. We have been learning about prequels in Literacy and have written our own prequel to the new class book 'The pirates next door'. This links with our new topic 'Are all coastlines the same?' which we also began to think about. In Maths, we have been learning about money - recognising and comparing amounts. Mrs Oliver was impressed with our knowledge and thinks some of us could be shopkeepers already! Our provision area has now been set up and we can't wait to start using the resources. Class 3


This week in Class 3 we have begun our new book - The Boy at the back of the class. We have used prediction and inference skills to complete a *Wordle* around the blurb and write a detailed and descriptive diary entry using Similes and Metaphors. We have used Dictionaries and Thesaurus' to create a word bank of new vocabulary and synonyms to extend our language choice. In RE we have begun our new topic of Miracles and exploring what a miracle is to them and how others may define this. We have begun our Humanities topic of The Romans and adopted a cross-curricula approach in learning a song all about Roman life and using a Timeline to understand where the Romans are in history and in relation to Jesus Christ and biblical stories. We of course welcomed our new furry addition - *Rupert* the Reading Rabbit into the class and read to him every day whilst also discussing how to care for him and make sure he is happy in our class. *Mrs Dereix*

Class 4

This week Class 4 have undertaken Maths activities which will provide an insight into any gaps in understanding which may require addressing over the half term. We have researched what life was like for Jewish people during WW2, with

a particular focus on Anne Frank and what we can learn from her diary. The children completed their own research before using their knowledge to complete an information text detailing everything they know about her. The children also took part in a hot-seating role play activity, playing the role of interviewers and Anne Frank in order to gain further insight into her thoughts and feelings of her life hidden away in the secret annex. We will use the emotions displayed to write our own diary entry in the style of Anne Frank next week. On Friday, the children put their sewing skills to good use as they learnt how to darn a sock, in keeping with the 'Make do and mend' slogan from WW2 - many thanks to Mrs Gallagher for taking the reins with this activity! *Mr McGuire*

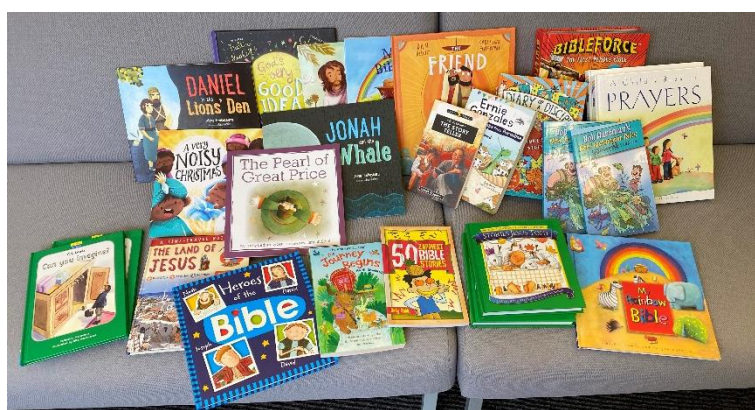

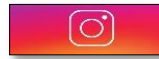
