




Class 3














Class 4 Science – children finding out whether changing the length of wire affects the brightness of a bulb in a circuit.

School News

Growing Together



The theme of this year's Children's Mental Health Week is Growing Together.

Growing Together is about growing emotionally and finding ways to help each other grow. Challenges and setbacks can help us to grow and adapt and trying new things can help us to move beyond our comfort zone into a new realm of possibility and potential!

Mrs Gallagher, Learning Mentor, has provided all class teachers with a range of *Growing Together* activities and the children will complete these next week in class.

Celebrations

Each Friday afternoon we gather as a whole school to celebrate the achievements of our pupils. During the collective worship, we celebrate their sporting, drama, dance, arts achievements, their personal progress in lessons, house points and attendance. We present our own *Star Pupil* certificates to the children and provide them also with an opportunity to share their swimming/gymnastic/football certificates or medals.

Next week we will be introducing weekly certificates to celebrate the children's achievement in Reading, Times Tables Rock Stars and Century Stars.

Times Tables Rock Stars was introduced to Class 3 and 4 in the last academic year. Times Tables Rock Stars is a carefully sequenced programme of daily times tables practice. Each week concentrates on a different

times table, with a recommended consolidation week for rehearsing the tables that have recently been practised every third week.

This program was initially introduced to Class 3 during the last academic year to consolidate their weekly multiplication times tables/mental arithmetic test and also prepare the Y4 children for the multiplication tables check (MTC) which is statutory for all primary schools (MTC was eventually cancelled by the DfE late last year due to Covid but will resume this year).

Century was also introduced to Classes 3 and 4 two years ago to aid their learning, especially in Maths. The Century program quickly identifies where learning is secure and which areas need revisiting. It turns homework into a powerful intervention activity as our class teachers can choose from thousands of resources to assign to individual pupils. Work is automatically marked so pupils receive instant personalised feedback with tips on how to improve.

Governors News
