In maths we have been learning about length. The children have been measuring a range of objects using centimetres, millimetres and metres. We have ordered lengths, compared lengths, drawn specific lengths and measured lengths. The children have worked extremely hard with their maths this week. In Science we learnt about animals' offspring. We discussed what different offspring are called and then sorted them into two categories. In Topic, we studied a range of aerial images looking for human and physical features in the photographs.

Class 3

This week Class 3 have enjoyed exploring sound in our new Science topic. We used rice and drums to see the vibrations and also looked at and made sound using other resources.

Year 3 have been measuring length in, mm, cm and m in maths and comparing and converting length too. Year 4 have been learning about area and finding the area of shape using their multiplication skills.

We enjoyed painting our clay flower bowls in Art. Mrs Metcalfe's glue gun was HOT - fixing all the broken bits, but most of them survived in the end! Everyone is very proud of their creations.

In literacy, we have been writing about the story 'Escape from Pompeii' and we have written some wonderful setting descriptions.

We have had a detailed discussion about the current world events and have watched a CBBC Newsround about why the Russians are attacking Ukraine. The children know if they have any questions they can talk to us about it. They were all very grown up and we had a really good discussion about it, finishing with saying a prayer for all involved.
